4.	Updates to Executive Committee Elections Reforms	
4.1	Ren Kai (Arts) updated the Council the response from the school administration about the elections reforms. The board of trustees' approval will be required before carrying out the reform but he highlighted that the reform will be pushed through unless the future council choose to reverse the decision. 5.	Passing of the Amendments to Elections Regulations	
5.1	Shermon (Law) presented to the Council the updates to the executive committee elections regulations and the proposed changes to the legal text of the management committee elections regulations	Ren Kai (Arts) to follow up with NUS and update the

5.3	Ren Kai (Arts) pointed out that there is flexibility for the management committee elections but he reminded the Council that 14 th of September is the Council Meeting. He pointed out that the election candidates should be reminded of this date earlyif their elections are held late.	
5.4	Yi Da (PA) proposed to adopt the new revised MC elections regulations, seconded by Ren Kai (Arts), the motion was passed without objections	
5.5	Total Voting Strength; 39 For: 38 Against: 1 Abstain: 0	
5.6	The 34 th NUSSU Council has decided to adopt the new set of MC elections regulations.	



6.	Updates to Bursary Donations and NUSSU Students' Fund Initiatives	
6.1	Ren Kai (Arts) presented to the Council the upcoming initiatives of Students' Fund in targeting the needy students. His presentation mainly covered the purchase of Ez-link vouchers to target studnets' transport needs and the enhancement of the Students' Fund bursary from \$1000 to \$1250. The publicity of the bursary will be out by end of August and he highlighted that NUSSU's bursaries cannot be given on top of NUS's cap limit and serves only to cover students that have fallen through the cracks. 6.2	Timothy (USC) asked about the number of bursaries given out by NUSSU each year.	
6.3	Ren Kai (Arts) clarified that in the last financial year, only 19 bursaries are given out	
6.4	Timothy (USC) asked if NUSSU should give out the bursaries to more people	
6.5	Ren Kai (Arts) clarified that the NUSSU bursaries are complimentary to the NUS bursary. He pointed out that the NUS bursary is already very comprehensive and is already covering most of the undergraduates in NUS	



6.	Discussion of Finance Issues in NUS	
6.1	Kenny (Law) presented to the Council his opinions on the finance issues within NUSSU and between NUSSU and the school administration. He pointed out that due to the mismatch between the dates of NUSSU's elections and the schools' financial periods, NUSSU is always forced to carry blind budgeting for the incoming committees. He proposed to have more flexibility in the budgeting and not be too fixated with the numbers, which is the case right now.	Information No Action Required
6.2	Kenny (Law) also touched on the possibility of raising the petty cash holdings from 1k to 10k and to shorten the time required to draw out the clubs' own reserves	
6.3	Ren Kai (Arts) proposed for a 5 minutes discussion, seconded by Wilson (Arts), the motion was passed without objections	
6.4	Wilson (Arts) shared with the council about line item budgeting and block item budgeting. He pointed out that for line item budgeting, distinctively there is less abuse for money but he asked the council if the school is over doing accountability and killing the stake of individual clubs	
6.5	Timothy (USC) agrees that nothing much can be done about the NUS financial procedures because it is an industry practice. He felt that the checks and balances are important but the overemphasis on the possibility of office bearers stealing money is an overused scare tactic for more control. He felt that there should be more flexibility and sees the need to make changes to NUS regulation 9 to make way for the right changes	
6.6	Cassandra (Sci) felt that many a times the problem lies with OSA and not OFS because they are just administrators. She provided a point of information that budget can be sent in later after the new team steps up but the money cannot be spent before that. She also posed an answer to Kenny's sub clubs issue in that if the budget is allocated in that manner, if the money if not spent the clubs has forfeited the money and it is not theirs anymore	



6.7	Kenny (Law) pointed out that it is more tricky than that because the sub clubs collect their own finances while Law Club does not allocated any budget to them	
6.8	Cass (Sci) suggested that Law Club consider breaking up their finances with these sub clubs because it is extremely difficult to draw out the reserves from these club. She also agreed that holding only 1k as petty cash is too little but felt that 10k is too much. She felt that a middle ground be striked and a petition drafted to be submitted before the 34th Council steps down	
6.9	Wilson (arts) proposed to extend the discussion by 5 minutes, seconded by Ren Kai (Arts), the motion was passed without objections	
6.10	Wilson (Arts) pointed out that the school is doing NUSSU a favour by doing the check and balance and he hope that one day such checks and balances can be done by another group of students instead of the school. Ultimately he feels that as student representatives, they are accountable to students	
6.11	Ren Kai (Arts) pointed out that trust comes in 2 ways. He asked the Council if the student representatives are portraying themselves in a way that can allow the administration to trust them with 3millions dollars. He pointed that some of the student leaders cannot even submit their excuse letters or commit themselves for duties of the club. He also cited several occasions when the Dean of OSA could give him examples of past Exco's ridiculous purchases and wavering decisions which put him in a difficult position to push for certain things	
6.12	Timothy (USC) believes in human progress and that it depends a lot on the group of people in office at that time	
6.13	Ren Kai (Arts) felt that the ball is 100% in the Union's court to do well now	
6.14	Yong Jie (Com) proposed to extend the discussion by 5 minutes, seconded by Jeannel (Com), the motion was passed without objections	
6.15	Yong Jie (Com) brought up the discussion about e-payment. He pointed out that it is not fair for volunteers to pay manually and also raised an example on the recent e-cyber games that they held, which required	



6.16	Derek (USC) pointed out that it is not a technical problem because the issue is the need to be a corporate entity first	
6.17	Yong Jie (Com) pointed out that it is possible for NUS to open one more account that is not tied to their main account but they are not willing	
6.18	Ren Kai (Arts) is of the opinion that the issue discussed is quite operational and he personally thinks that it is a plausible endeavour. He asked for members that are interested in the idea to contact him and they can contact the Office of Finance together about the issue	
6.19	Ren Kai (Arts) gave his final address to the Council and he ending he pointed out that the role of Council is to represent the student at large and not to defend their own management committees	
6.20	On behalf of the NUSSU Exco, Ren Kai (Arts) proposed a motion of thanks to the council members for their active participation	
6.21	Ren Kai (Arts) proposed a motion of appreciation to David (Med) for being one of the best Council chairpersons of this time	
6.22	Derek (USC) expressed his thanks to the Council Chairperson and the NUSSU Exco for the active engagement within the Council	
6.23	David (Med) thanked the Council and reminded everyone that there is a limit in the number of things that can be done in a term. He reassured everyone that progress has been made and the Council is at a better place today.
