The thing about needs and wants is that it is a dynamic thing that changes.	
1.8	Clovis, Com Q: Things that you want to priorities when you step up. Ans: My focus would be on quality education since this is what students pay for. Quality time thru smaller class size.	
1.9	Clovis, Com Q: Cons of decreasing class size and how to go about doing it. Ans: Need to hire more faculty staff. NUS President is concern that bringing in too many faculty staff will affect quality of education. Strain on faculties if didn't bring in. Likely to leave if they are given workload. Need of	



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	increasing school fees to maintain quality which may not be beneficial to students. Increasing the no of students we are taking in at a different raise. School is support and propose to MOE for more funding	Information No Action Required
1.10	Wei Yuan, Arts Q: How do you plan to find out what the students want? Ans. Mainly done in the form of surveys but students do not really want to do these surveys. Need to get support from faculty clubs as they are able reach out to the people better. Ineffective for NUSSU Exco to go down and collect themselves.	
1.11	Wei Yuan, Arts. How much have u done in terms of research. Certain things have been address before. Ans: Done adequate research in terms of both Rongxin's and Clovis's term. In the case of returning of scripts, it may not be possible for classes that are more subjective but for classes that are more quantitative where exact answers can be determined, I don't see why this scripts can't be returned.	
1.12	Shermon, CSC Q: What do u think of the 500,000 donation, reconcile with what students fund is doing bearing in my both predecessors are against this donation. Ans: I believe that this donation dilutes the identity of students fund but on the other hand if by giving this sum of money to the school, these funds can be utilised more efficiently, I don't see why we should be against it. Whoever who can disperse this funds the best should be given the funds.	
1.13	Wei Wei, Sci Q: How do you want to engage the con clubs? Ans: Gather the welfare secretary of each club to work closely with Exco. Not merely thru survey but talks. Start from the Exco members of each con club and getting to know them better.	
1.14	Willie, Biz Q: If donating the money is more efficient. What's then is the role of students' fund. Ans: Doing stuff to compliment the efforts. Don't think they are not as relevant.	
1.15	Willie, Biz Q: Money should be used in the most responsible way. Why then should we use the money inefficiently? Ans: Students want to do something for other students. Initiatives not done in other schools. This issue highlights the fact they need to step up their efforts.	
1.16	Shermon, CSC Q: Are people who get schools aid disqualified from BA and BG? What's the difference between BA and BG and are they utilize efficiently?	



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	<p>Ans: Students who get financial aid from the university are not allowed to apply for BA but they can still apply for BG. BA has a higher quantum compared to BG. On the overall, the application success rate does not reach a very high level. Not more than 70% of the selected applicants get their BA/BG. Evaluating their eligibility requires many steps, including interviewing family members. It is not fool-proof but is the best that we have currently.</p>	
1.17	<p>Clovis, Com Q: Top three issues of ISB. Ans: The first issue is on Bus Bunching. I think the buses are not utilised efficiently. Secondly, overcrowding during peak periods. This I also believe is due to ineffective use of buses. Thirdly is the usage of buses. Intend to work with office. Highlight the issues to OED and support the focus group discussion as requested by OED.</p>	
1.18	<p>Clovis, Com Q: Punctuality of bus drivers. Ans: I think the main issues lies with the mentality of the bus drivers. We should highlight this to the bus drivers.</p>	
1.19	<p>Shermon, CSC Q: What is the primary culprit for spending too much time on a single bus stop? Ans: Students rushing to get on the bus regardless of how full it is.</p>	
1.20	<p>Shermon, CSC Q: Housing needs/wants? Ans: No longer have jurisdiction over housing handed back to OSA by the previous Welfare Secretary.</p>	
1.21	<p>Shermon, CSC Q: What do you think of the NTU System where the distance from home a factor in this? Ans: I think we can explore this avenue and of course adopt it if it is feasible. A consultation process can be started.</p>	
1.22	<p>Wei Wei, Sci Q: How important to personally understand the students needs? Ans: If I don't understand what the students needs I won't be running for the role of Welfare Secretary.</p>	
1.23	<p>Wei Wei, Sci Q: More active measures would u take to engage the students? Ans: I will convene a gathering of all Welfare Directors of all Clubs together and brainstorm on ideas on how to better engage the students.</p>	
1.24	<p>Sean, Biz Q: Why do you propose to outsource welfare to the con clubs. Ans: I think it is more efficient that way as con clubs are the people on the ground.</p>	



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1.25	<p>Sean, Biz Q: In what way are you able to value add other than through a feedback channel.</p> <p>Ans: Shared perspective, augment. In summary consolidate feedback and concretise the plans.</p>	
1.26	<p>Shermon, CSC Q: Do you take public transport?</p> <p>Ans: Yes</p>	
1.27	<p>Shermon, CSC Q: Do you think that focus group can be rolled out in this term?</p> <p>Ans: There are existing focus groups.</p>	
1.28	<p>Clovis, Com Q: What would you be looking out for when attending tender meetings?</p> <p>Ans: Prices, quality of food and whether it is hala or not.</p>	
1.29	<p>Shermon, CSC Q: Do you think as an arts student you know what students of other faculties need?</p> <p>Ans: No. That is also why I will propose a discussion with all the welfare directors.</p>	
1.30	<p>Zitong, PA Q: Halal food is more expensive how to maintain a balance between food and price.</p> <p>Ans: The main concern is that the dietary needs of all students need to be taken care of, including Muslim students. As such, if there is a choice between more expensive halal food and less expensive non-halal food, I will choose the first one if there are no existing halal stalls. That said, we will continue working with OED to ensure the affordability of food on campus.</p>	
1.31	<p>Shermon, Sci Q: Is there a need to engage the welfare sect to engage the students?</p> <p>Ans: There is a need engage them on the personal level.</p>	
1.32	<p>Clovis, Com Q: How do non fac clubs come into play?</p> <p>Ans: Without all of their support we won't be able to function. They have students under their charge and we would definitely support them.</p>	
1.33	<p>Mabel, Engine Q: What kind of issues would you want us to bring up?</p> <p>Ans: Consolidation of common problems.</p>	
1.34	<p>Sean, Biz Q: How about associated bodies?</p> <p>Ans: They have the different initiatives that are on going and some of what they are doing is a replication of what we are doing. Across the board, as</p>	



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	welfare directors they will have the same concerns.	
1.35	Clovis Q What is the plans for welfare standing committee. Ans: Improve the RAS system. Factor and locality.	
1.36	Mabel, Engine Q: How can they improve in collecting feedbacks? Especially since most of the time answers given are not truthful and feedback given is not relevant. Ans: We could move away from the welfare survey model through other feedback collection channels	
1.37	Raghav, Eng Q: They fill up the survey in a rush and do whatever you want them to just to collect the packs. Ans: I think we should sit down and discuss on how to get a better form of feedback.	
1.38	Mabel, Eng Q: Award respondents with CORS bidding points? Ans: Replacing one incentive (welfare packs) with another (CORS bidding points) will not solve the issue of unreliable responses.	
1.39	Shermon, CSC Q: Are surveys inherently unreliably would u consider other forms of feedback collections such feedback emails and data collections. Ans: We already have alternative sources of feedback collection for example the <a href="mailto:feedback@nussu.org.sg">feedback@nussu.org.sg</a> email where students can come to us when they have any concern.	
1.40	Shermon, CSC Q: Do you think the union knows everything? Ans: To say union knows everything is presumptuous.	
1.41	Jiaxin, Arts Q: On what basis would u differentiate needs and wants? Ans: Needs are some things that students cannot function without in their daily student lives. For wants, they are good-to-have items but something that students can still live without. An example is that of professors. A need is a professor who teaches reasonably well. A want is a caring professor who goes all out to make sure that your learning environment is top-notch.
