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rooms and student lounge. Also, there are mobile planks to form small cubicles at the student lounge.

- 1.1.9 Zan, CAC Q: Is the cubicle in the student lounge private?
Ans: It is private but not soundproof due to the physical structure of the mobile planks
- 1.1.10 Aik Loong, CSC Q: What is the NUSSU Van driver system in the 35th NUSSU Exco? And why is there a restriction of the number of driver for this term?
A: There are more than 100 people applying for orientation but most people only use the van for 1 or 2 times. Therefore, the limitation will reserve the usage for more frequent drivers and allow rotational usage.
- 1.1.11 Aik Loong, CSC Q: Will every club be given the same limit in number of drivers regardless of the different number of project from the various club?
A: Recognized that certain clubs have more projects than others. If there is a need the secretariat cell will personally help to drive or seek help from other clubs to support the events.
- 1.1.12 Joshua, Arts Q: What is the rationale to limit the number of drivers?
Ans: Lesser drivers will lead to more frequency in driving and thus build the confidence of the drivers.
- 1.1.13 Zan, CAC Q: Is the rationale of limiting the number of drivers to prevent the van from getting damaged?
Ans: No. It is about allowing drivers to be familiarized. Also, it is to ensure the safety of the drivers and passengers.
- 1.1.14 Joshua, Arts Q: Why not have a more stringent van orientation for the drivers to ensure safety of drivers and passengers?
Ans: There is a difference between orientating on campus and driving it outside of campus.
- 1.1.15 Derrick, Business Q: Would like to clarify on the rationale of limiting the number of drivers going for van orientation and how does it links to maximizing resources.
Ans: More drivers will lead to difficulty in keeping track of who are using it frequently. Some drivers may have stopped driving for 1 to 2 years and come back to drive without familiarization and confidence.

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- 1.1.16 Weilson, Sports Q: How can sports club use the online booking system to assist on their heavily usage for meeting. Will the process be instantaneous?
Ans: Yes, the process is quick.
- 1.1.17 Jennifer, CSC Q: In regards to YIH gathering, is it exclusive since it is only for the clubs located in YIH.
Ans: Not exclusive, the purpose is to bring neighbours closer to each other. YIH stakeholders will know the compound better and thus they will be more involved in it. There are other platforms such as Union Tea to invite outsiders.

Ans: Will be open to other clubs but would like to test-pilot this gathering in small scale first.
- 1.1.19 Shea Min, CAC Q: For the online booking system, it is based on first-come-first-serve or based on urgency?
Ans: It is based on first-come-first-serve. However if there is a clash, will try to work out a solution for both parties.

Ans: Will encourage everyone to be involved and state the rationale of it. Aims to go down personally to talk to the clubs.

- 1.2.8 Derrick, Business Q: What is the role of the deputy finance secretary other than managing the finances for NUSSU Committees?
Ans: They will be helping her to liaise with OFS officer to increase the productivity of the offices.
- 1.2.9 Seng Chiy, USC Q: What do you wish to achieve by having participatory budgeting?
Ans: It will be mainly on to have a sense of engagement and sense of belongings from the students' side. We are trying to prioritize the

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students' interest for the Union as it is impossible to serve the entire funding request. More than that, it serves as the advisory role for the finance cell.

1.2.10 Seng Chiy, USC Q: Will there be an information gap for student side?

Ans: There is a mini Q&A session for them to know more regarding the budget. They can leverage their needs through it.

1.2.11 Seng Chiy, USC Q: What are the obstacles for this issue?

Ans: What I foresee is that the prioritization of money request as it is very difficult to satisfy the every request. Not everyone agree with the request as we need to explain the rationale to the students and let them know where we are coming from.

1.2.12 Seng Chiy, USC Q: Will there be a bias opinion for NUSSU Committees when it comes to participatory budgeting?

Ans: I engage all the NUSSU Committees and allow them to have an open platform to discuss these matters. It is quite hard to put a value to judge whether this initiative is more important than one another. They will submit their own budget and they will have an overview how NUSSU Committees file their budget.

1.2.13 Jennifer, CSC Q: Who will be involved in the justification of the financial countersigning?

Ans: I believe that my deputy financial secretary has the power to decide it. I believe in the countersigning together with the NUSSU president to achieve justification of financial countersigning.

1.2.14 Derrick, Business Q: What happen if the projects exceed the budget or council thinks the budget that they propose is not justifiable?

Ans: We will expect the party to take full responsibility of their own budget. We will be able to warn them before they exceed their budget once they submitted their budget. More, we will be doing mid event review with them to prevent such things from happening.

1.2.15 Joshua, Arts Q: Do you foresee any obstacles for increasing the subscription fees?

Ans: If we decide to increase the fees, we need to take a baby step and increase the fees gradually. It is our responsible to inform the students regarding the use of the subscription fees.

1.2.16 Joshua, Arts Q: What is the rationale to let council to approve the

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budget?

Ans: In the first place, EXCO don't have the power to amend the budget. I see it as check and balance and let everyone to know the priority of the Con Clubs. It is eventually to reach a consensus.

1.2.17 Seng Chiy, USC Q: What do you envision the purpose of publicizing budget at council?

Ans: It is mainly on the discussion part and let everyone have a better understanding of how the budget is going to spend.

1.2.18 Seng Chiy, USC Q: Why is there a vote for the discussion of budget at council?

Ans: It is a decision made by the 34th Council. Anyone of you thinks it is inappropriate to do so; we can always make an amendment to it. I will appoint Finance Standing Committee can look at this issue.

1.2.19 Zhong Xian, Sports Q: What are your stands for discussion of budget at council?

Ans: My stand will be neutral and if majority of you think that you are not comfortable in putting your budget up for discussion, we can consolidate the budget and pass the budget in bulk.

1.2.20 Tomoe, USC Q: The council will be conducting a vote for the passing of the budget and yet in the constitution, it written that Exco has the power to amend the budget. Can you comment on it?

Ans: The budget itself needs to be voted at the council level and I think that Exco is not in an appropriate stand to amend any budget.

1.2.21 Jing Da, Engineering Q: You did mention about passing sponsorship to Constituent Clubs? How do you see the need of the certain sponsorship of a certain Con Club?

Ans: I will propose by having de-conflicting session with all the Constituent Clubs and ask for their needs so that we can cater to their needs. I will try my best to satisfy the need of the Constituent Clubs.

1.3.11 Tomoe, CSC Q: What is the unified image of the Union that you are looking at?

Ans: As for the objective of the cell, I would like to reflect the aim of the Union and give a consistent image to the public.

1.3.12 Tomoe, CSC Q: How do you see different constituent clubs under NUSSU to fit into this unified image?

Ans: All the constituent clubs stand alone. Lots of discrepancy and different clubs have the different views. Through Union umbrella, we are looking at constituent clubs to come in and join us.

1.3.13 Davis, Computing Q: How are you going to solve the problem with those apathetic students that do not have any concern for NUSSU?

Ans: I would like to increase the awareness through word of mouth. For examples, through my existence in 35th NUSSU EXCO, more people in Medicine are keen to know more about NUSSU.

1.3.14 Davis, Computing Q: What do you think of having an introduction of Union to freshmen, especially for constituent clubs?

A: As for COINS portal, it is the very first stop for students to know about all the constituent clubs. I currently unsure whether all the clubs have the same avenue to meet all the freshmen. But, as for Medicine side, we do meet all the freshmen once they have enrolled.

1.3.15 Jennifer, CSC Q: From what I know, NUSSU email blast won't be available during summer holidays. Will there be any amendments for that?

Ans: We will look into the issue. Priority for NUSSU blast goes to NUSSU committees. In the event that we are going to send out email during summer holidays, we will send out the email for fortnightly basis

1.3.16 Jacqueline, Arts Q: What about the feedback portal as mentioned by Jeanette earlier on? Are you going to see it as part of the workload under Communication Cell?

Ans: We will liaise with different cells to work with this feedback portal. Relation Cell will be mainly in charge for the portal.

1.3.17 Zhong Xian, Sports Q: What is the outreach for The Ridge? And

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how are you going to increase the outreach?

Ans: As for now, The Ridge has 6000 copies in circulation. The outreach has not met the requirement from what I know. We have been talking to The Ridge to increase the publication and reduce the number of circulation. Moreover, The Ridge is looking to write more than NUSSU. In summary, my opinion is to up the publication and reduce the number of circulation.

1.3.18 Davis, Computing Q: Is it possible to include The Ridge in acceptance packages?

Ans: As for now, we are unsure whether we can include it in the package.

Ans: From what I know, we are unable to keep track for website. As for now, we do have 8K likes for Facebook.

1.4.7 Jennifer, CSC Q: Can you elaborate more on your transport subsidies? How is it different from the other initiative that comes from financial aid?

Ans: NUSSU SF has transport subsidies before this but it terminated due to certain reasons. Students spend a substantial amount of money on transport side.

1.4.8 Huimin, Science Q: What is your ideal relationship with different constituent clubs?

Ans: Welfare secretary cannot identify the exact problem of every group of students. Welfare director from the various constituent clubs will have more knowledge than me. Thus, he will engage them through informal channels to understand more about those problems.

1.4.9 Jacqueline, Arts Q: You did mention that you are going to do an alumni network? How is it different from the school administrative side of alumni network?

Ans: Business faculty has a strong alumni network, but for Engineering and Science it isn't so strong. It will be very enriching for students to have a strong alumni network through a general platform.

1.4.10 Jennifer, CSC Q: How exactly are you going to include non-faculty clubs into your welfare plans?

Ans: At this moment, he could not think of how the welfare cell can work with non-faculty clubs as the non-faculty clubs have their own diversity. But he will want to look closely to see how he can improve on this.

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- 1.4.11 Joshua, Arts Q: What is your stand/portfolio when it comes to the feedback portal?
Ans: Work hand in hand with Relation Cell. Welfare survey results can be put up onto the feedback portal for the general students' perusal.
- 1.4.12 Zen, CAC Q: What will be the agenda for welfare standing committee?
Ans: My very first agenda will be adjusting student apathy because with apathetic student population, we cannot do much without their help.
- 1.4.13 Tomoe, CSC Q: What does student welfare means to you? What is it necessary to have welfare and who needs it?
Ans: Student welfare is mainly about needs and wants. Needs are like lecture theater and wants are like welfare pack. Every student requires certain basic needs but wants will be extra for them.

Ans: Welfare survey is not the only platform to understand students. There are other initiatives that I am looking at such as NUSSU walkabout and ChangeNUS. For instances, I can work with Presidential Cell to know more about FOCC as it has a larger pool of people and so we can tap on it to really understand their needs
- 1.4.15 Seng Chiy, USC Q: A lot of people think that the meal plan in Utown is taxing for the students. What are your thoughts about this?
Ans: My way of doing things will be through reasonable basis. I will engage the Relation Cell to focus on this problem and I will pass the report and work with OCA to discuss this matter.
- 1.4.16 Tomoe, CSC Q: What is the role of the welfare cell in NUSSU Academy?
Ans: If there is an issue that relates to welfare, the welfare cell will be part of it in the event that we have enough manpower at our side.
- 1.4.17 Kenneth, CSC Q: What are the pressing problems that faced by students today and are your initiatives cater to it?
Ans: Shuttle bus services, there are long term and short term solutions to it. Student Apathy, I will be using my goals to reach out to student population.

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- 1.4.18 Seng Chiy, USC Q: Most of the problems that you proposed will be outsourced to other cells especially to NUSSU Academy, why don't you spearhead the solutions?
Ans: In the event that we do not have NUSSU Academy, I will spearhead the initiative myself. With the presence of NUSSU Academy, and for that side, they do have enough manpower to conduct by themselves.
- 1.4.19 Seng Chiy, USC Q: What is the constitutional role of the Student Welfare Secretary?
Ans: I will be the point of contact with all the student offices.

A: At Central Library.

A: For now, I am looking at Central library as it is strategic venue and has a good pool of crowd for feedbacks.

Ans: As for now, I will work with Central Library and gather feedbacks from the librarians. If the feedbacks are good, I would like to add charging stations in other faculties and libraries.
